



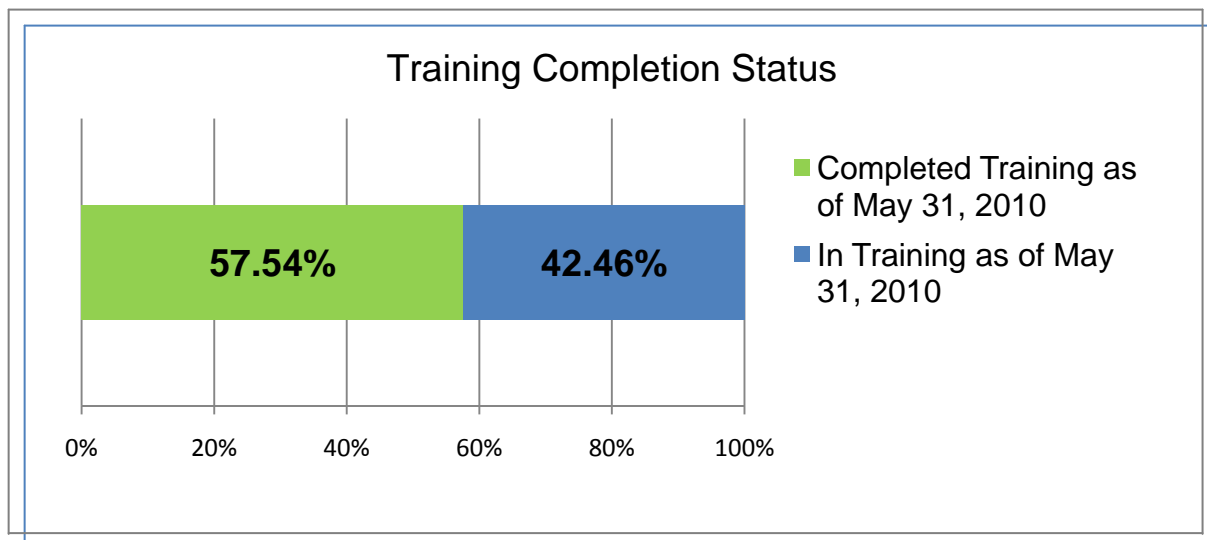
American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA)

Central Region Workforce Development

Status as of May 31, 2010

An intention of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act is to assist those most impacted by the recession. Recovery Act funds are being made available to provide career assessments, remedial, and occupational training for unemployed, underemployed, and dislocated workers. To follow is a snapshot, as of May 31, 2010, of the number of people who have utilized PA CareerLink® services for career assessments and to locate a training program that meets their interests and career goals.

The Central Region Summer Employment Experience (SEE) surpassed its goal to serve at least double the number of eligible low-income youth with barriers to employment that currently receive services under the year-round Workforce Investment Act (WIA) youth program. Over a seven week period during the summer of 2009, the SEE Program provided work experience and career development services for **nearly 700 youth** ages 14 to 24.
